***Margaret Brayshaw (May 23, 2020) and Ray Brayshaw (Aug 5, 2021)***

Marg and Ray Brayshaw were married for 72 years before Marg died in May 2020. Ray left her a short 14 months later. Marg was born in Manitoba, and later moved to Ontario with her family. She moved to Montreal General Hospital to pursue a nursing diploma, and later to Galt, where she married Ray. Ray, born and raised in Galt, quit high school the day of his 18th birthday, in order to join the military during WWII. They raised their 3 sons on Francis Street, where they attended St. Tom's. While Ray owned and operated Brayshaw Fine Foods grocery with his brother, Marg nursed at Cambridge Memorial. According to their son, Dave, his Dad was gregarious and his Mum was the one who 'ran the family' with a firm hand. Marg and Ray lived at Riverbend Place for the last several years, where they were lucky to continue the friendship and ministry of Canon Karen.

Kent Gardiner was a farmer in his hometown of Tilbury for many years before he entered the Anglican priesthood. He and his beloved Helen served many southwestern Ontario parishes while they raised 4 children. 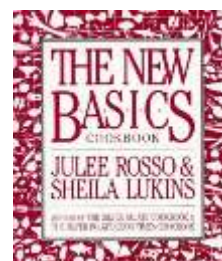
## **RECIPE OF THE MONTH → Macaroni & Cheese**

*(submitted by Sharon Furnival)*

**Makes:** 8 servings

### **Ingredients**

- 1 pound penne
- 4 cups milk
- 4 tablespoons (1/2 stick) unsalted butter
- 6 tablespoons unbleached all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- salt and freshly ground black pepper
- 12 ounces Gruyère cheese, *grated*



### **Directions**

- 1 Bring a large pot of water to a boil. Add the penne and cook at a rolling boil until just tender. Drain, rinse under cold water, drain again and set aside in a large bowl.
- 2 Preheat the oven to 350°F.
- 3 Bring the milk just to a boil in a heavy saucepan and set aside.
- 4 Meanwhile, melt the butter in another heavy saucepan. Add the flour, and whisk over low heat for 5 minutes. Do not brown. Remove from the heat.
- 5 Add the hot milk to the flour mixture, and whisk well. Add ½ teaspoon of the paprika, season with salt and pepper, and return the pan to the heat. Cook over medium heat, whisking constantly, until the mixture thickens, 5 minutes. Add to the penne, and toss well to coat the penne completely.
- 6 Butter a 13 × 9 × 2-inch flameproof baking dish, and fill it evenly with the penne and sauce.
- 7 Distribute the grated cheese evenly over the penne, and sprinkle with black pepper and additional paprika.

## **Pastor's Ponderings**

Ah.... November! A season and a time of completion. The setting of the Sun comes earlier, the Sun doesn't rise nor peek its' head above the clouds until later in the morning. There's the inevitable chill in the air and the process of "bundling up" has begun! November brings us a seasonal change and it brings us to a phase of completion. The word "November" comes from the Latin word "*novem*" meaning nine. To the Ancient Greeks and to the Romans, this was the ninth month, a time which lends itself, Scripturally, to *completion, patience and development*.

It is in this month, we are reminded to be patient, to be patient with ourselves, with our neighbours, co-workers, family members and friends, that they too are growing, growing each moment, each day in the image of God. It is in this month we remember the race run by those who have died that they may rest in peace and rise in Christ's glory. We will remember them. Steve+
