Selection Committee for our New Priest: UPDATE

Along with four representatives from St. Luke's, our St. Tom's representatives **Chris Coady, Lee Haskins, Rick Furnival, and Kathy Brown** are continuing the challenging task of choosing a new priest for our parishes. They have completed the first 3 steps in the process (listed in the August newsletter), including a rigorous profile of our parish that will be submitted to the Bishop's office. *In September, all of you will be asked to complete a survey telling the committee what you are looking for in a priest.* You may also contact one of our representatives to discuss your thoughts in person.

Step 4 (early Sept):	send out a survey to congregation to determine what the majority of people are looking for in our next priest
Step 5 <i>(end Sept)</i> :	compile survey results and send details of what type of person we're looking for to Bishop Todd
Step 6 (hopefully mid-Oct): receive a list of names from Bishop Todd of possible candidates and begin interviews
With any luck ?	may have a priest just in time for Christmas or early in new year



Please pray for everyone on the Selection Committee (both ours and St Luke's) throughout this process. PRAY for God's guidance in bringing us the right candidates and pointing us to the right person.

It has been SO nice to enjoy refreshments and fellowship after the service again! In order to keep everyone safe:


- o Please wear your mask to go to and from your table and only remove for eating/drinking

IT'S HARVEST TIME:

EASY BUTTERNUT SQUASH SOUP



- Ingredients
- 1/2 Tbsp. olive oil
- 2 garlic cloves minced
- 1 onion diced
- 1 butternut squash peeled and diced into cubes
- 32 ounces vegetable broth
 - 1-2 tsp. salt

Don't want to cut a squash yourself? Buy already cut cubes in the freezer section of your grocery store, and skip the 15-20 minute simmer.

Instructions

- 1. In a dutch oven pot (or heavy pot), heat olive oil over medium heat. Add onion and garlic. cook until softened, about 5 minutes.
- 2. Add cut up butternut squash and vegetable broth.
 - For fresh squash: Bring to a boil then cover and simmer for 15-20 minutes until squash is softened.
 - For frozen pre-cut squash cubes: Bring to a boil and then go to
- 3. Carefully pour entire contents of pot into blender. Add salt to taste.
- 4. Carefully blend until smooth. Serve in bowls with thyme if desired. Enjoy!

PWRDF working in UKRAINE

Alexander, 81, does not want to leave his home in the Donetsk region of Eastern Ukraine. He has been hiding in his basement and the bathroom to escape the shelling which has already hit his house. "I'm not going to leave here," he says. "I hide in the basement from shelling. Now I sometimes spend the night there, or in the bathroom, which I secured after a shell hit the house. I'm afraid that everything I have can be destroyed in a second. But I hope for a speedy peace."

Alexander is getting support from HelpAge International who brings him food and conversation. "After talking with her, I want to live. God give her strength."

PWRDF is partnering with HelpAge to support seniors in Ukraine as they attempt to cross the border into Moldova where HelpAge has worked since 2000. Moldovans and their government are providing needed support to those escaping the conflict.

[Note from Susan Grenville: I am soon going to be the same age as Alexander. As I sit safely in Cambridge, I can't imagine living the life he and others in Ukraine are presently living. Praying is not enough; we need to help however we can.]
